Subj: HISTORICAL AND ARCHEOLOGICAL RESOURCES PROTECTION (HARP) PLAN

1. Purpose. To provide an NAS Pensacola cultural resources protection plan which establishes the policies, responsibilities, and procedures for protecting the Archeological and Historical Resources located on board NAS Pensacola.

2. Scope. This instruction applies to all the cultural resources located within the boundaries of NAS Pensacola. These cultural resources include:

- a. Historical Buildings and Historical Structures
- b. Archeological Sites and Artifacts
- c. Palentological Remains

3. Background. Enclosure (1) has been developed per references (a) through (f). The HARP Plan incorporated these documents' principles and guidelines into a plan specifically prepared to meet the cultural resources management needs of NAS Pensacola.

a. Reference (a) states that "The heads of all Federal agencies shall assume responsibility for the preservation of historic properties which are owned or controlled by such agency.... each Federal agency shall establish a program to locate, inventory, and nominate to the Secretary of the Interior all properties under the agency's ownership or control by the agency that appear to qualify for inclusion on the National Register Each Federal agency shall exercise caution to assure any such property that might qualify for inclusion is not inadvertently transferred, sold, demolished, substantially altered, or allowed to deteriorate significantly."

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b. Reference (a) establishes the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, and independent Federal agency. All plans, projects, or programs likely to effect any resource listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places shall be submitted to the Advisory Council for review.

c. Reference (a) also outlines required procedures in this review process, which commences with a first review by the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) appointed by the governor of each state.

d. References (b) through (f) further mandate Federal agency responsibilities and specific Navy Instructions.

4. Policy. It is the policy of NAS Pensacola to support preservation of the Historical and Archeological Resources located on board NAS Pensacola and to mitigate any adverse effects of said resources should preservation not be possible. Copies of the NAS Pensacola Harp Plan are available from the NAS Pensacola Facilities Management Department, Building 1754.

5. Action. All Host and Tenant Commands, Department Heads, and Special Assistants at all levels shall comply with the NAS Pensacola HARP Plan.
