If 25 or older: Do not eat or drink except water, 14 hours prior to exam. No alcohol and fried food 3 days prior. Medical can nominate you for the IRR if you do not keep your physical and shots updated.

Physicals performed in August and February are done only on Sunday due to the Advancement exam. No physicals are done by Medical in October due to Medical doing their PRT.

_____These notes are taken directly from Chapter 12 of the Master-at-Arms rate-training manual, and applies directly to the support we provide to NAS.

Community Relations Procedures

As a patrolman, your personal appearance and conduct must be exemplary. You must avoid actions and attitudes that could be detrimental to community relations. Through your actions, you must create an impression of professional competence and service in the community.

When you are performing duty on a naval base, you must remember that you are a representative of the naval service and constantly in public view. As such, you must maintain a reputation for smartness, alertness, and efficiency. Equipment and vehicles must be kept clean and in good repair.

Service personnel are quick to notice and criticize faults in the uniform and behavior of patrol personnel. The following procedures will contribute to the overall community relations program.

Do not smoke while in public view.

Limit conversations with the public. Many civil police agencies limit informal conversations to **3 minutes or less**.

Do not loiter **or lean** against buildings or objects.

When driving police vehicles, use restraint and caution in emergencies, and drive slowly while on routine patrol.

Be courteous and professional when talking either in person or on the telephone.

The **proper** use of a notebook lends an air of professionalism to the patrolman [NO GROCERY LISTS].

ADVANCEMENT EXAMS: E1 to E6 Exams are next month on Sunday continue your studying and be prepared lets advance off this next exam cycle. The rates are opening up as evidenced by our last exam cycle.

WATCHSTANDING: All personnel are responsible for being at their assigned location of duty in the proper uniform and with all their proper equipment on time and standing by to assume the watch. Never leave your watch post unattended. You are required to remain on your post until properly relieved by your shipmate or released by proper authority. Leaving your post commits a **VERY SERIOUS OFFENSE** under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

Article 92: Failure to Obey Order or Regulation Part (3) Derelict in the performance of his or her duties.

Dereliction of Duty. Dereliction in the performance of duties occurs when a person willfully or negligently fails to perform them or performs them in a culpable inefficient manner. To be guilty of inefficiency, an accused must have had the ability to perform the assigned duties efficiently, but performed them inefficiently nevertheless.

This is one of the most dangerous actions to take especially in Combat duty or Security Police duties. In war time punishment can be **DEATH** for failing to follow your orders to the specification.

In addition to Article 92 you can also be charged under Article 134 The General Article.
